



Ben Walker's Texaco Station will be reviewed for the National Historic Register in September, 2019!!



Tales of the Branding Iron. Did you ever wonder how a brand came to be? What is the story behind it? We are collecting and framing the local brands and they have some interesting histories. Some local brands are pictured here. These stories are handed down by ancestors who may have come up with the brand or purchased the brand and know the story behind it. If we don't work to preserve these stories, they will be lost. This is the heritage part of our museum that is beginning to grow--won't you be a part of it?

The Rocking R brand & came into being when the owner of an Oklahoma ranch was thrown from a horse and so injured that he was forced thereafter to direct the activities of his

that he was forced thereafter to direct the activities of his ranch from a rocking chair.

The Double O brand was devised by a heartbroken husband, whose wife was killed by Indians soon after they had settled on their ranch. The brand symbolizes their two wedding rings.

The Guitar brand was established by a young New Mexico rancher who had wooed and won his beautiful Mexican wife by serenading her with that instrument.

The Broken Arrow brand was used by a Colorado rancher whose wagon train had been attacked by Indians. During the fight an arrow struck the butt of his rifle and broke, thus saving his life.

The famous Texas brand, the Barbecue, Bo , was used because of the owner's inordinate fondness for meat cooked in that fashion.

The Bar V M brand was devised and used by a Wyoming rancher as a memorial to the sweetheart of his youth who had died before they could be married. His name was Marvin and hers Virginia.







Ellis Knoll shared some stories told by his uncle, Fred Davis, who worked for Ben Walker at the Texaco Gas Station. The following are those stories:

They would send a truck to Grand Junction each fall for peaches to sell. One year they had a bunch of overripe peaches so decided to make peach brandy!

Ben helped families move to Steamboat Springs during the depression.

The had a drive-on ramp on the east side of the station. One time a person drove his car up on and without thinking, opened the door and stepped out. He got up and brushed himself off and said "Pert near hurt myself!"

Ben would send a truck to the packing houses in Denver (I think each fall). They would pick up animals at various farms until they had a load.

Ben looked after his customers. One time he sent Fred to Greeley with a very sick girl. She had rheumatic fever.

He carried a lot of people on the books until they could pay their bills. People would borrow money from him when they needed some cash.
